- A \$50 application fee is payable in full <u>prior</u> to the application deadline, September 1, 2018 with no exceptions. Please make checks payable to "MOJD".
- I have read the Rules and Regulations of the Miss Oregon Job's Daughter Program.
- There are no guaranteed traveling funds for Miss Oregon Job's Daughter and I will be expected to travel within the state of Oregon to promote Job's Daughters, to represent the Order to the public and to other Masonic organizations, possibly at my own expense.
- I will be required to attend Supreme Session 2019 to be held August 7 10, 2019 at Overland Park Convention Center in Overland Park, Kansas to represent Oregon in the Miss International Job's Daughter Pageant, possibly at my own expense.
- I must submit a travel itinerary with my chaperones names for all travel associated with the responsibilities of MOJD to the MOJD Program Chair.

References Request

As part of this year's Miss Oregon Job's Daughter Pageant, we are asking each contestant to submit TWO letters of recommendation.

One should be from someone WITHIN the Job's Daughters community. Someone from your Bethel, your lodge, or a member of another Masonic family organization; an adult who knows you well and can speak of your ability to represent Oregon Job's Daughters well based on their experiences with you.

The other should be from someone OUTSIDE the Job's Daughters community. It could be a teacher, a counselor, a family friend, an employer or a neighbor; an adult who also knows you well and can tell us about your life outside of Job's Daughters and why it makes you a great candidate for MOJD.

These letters do not need to be long, and do not need to include a list of all of your accomplishments. One page is enough, two pages is plenty. Please ask them to focus on how you are an example of the qualities that make a great Job's Daughter: Leadership, friendship, kindness, responsibility, participation, etc. Remember, even though they love you and want to help, family members are prohibited from providing references for an applicant.
